

# INVESTMENT IN HEAD START

In 12 other states; Fiscal year 2017



In fiscal year 2017, 12 other states invested an average of **.039%** of state expenditures in Head Start and/or Early Head Start. The median percentage of total expenditures invested was **.018%**. California currently does **not** provide funding to Head Start or Early Head Start programs.
